<u>PCC Members and Church Wardens</u>: The nomination forms are available in both Churches. Please fill them in and give them to Revd Jane or one of the Church Wardens or pop them into the parish office.

<u>APCM</u> (Annual Parochial Church Meeting) will be held on Sunday 14th April at 6.00pm in St Chad's. Can you help/volunteer?

There are lots of roles within the life of our church which are made easier by more people being involved:-

**Reading during Sunday Services** – a rota of people meaning no-one need to read more than once every 3 months at Chad's and once every two months at Barts

**Prayers during Sunday Services** – a rota of people who put the prayers together and lead them during the service. There are plenty of books available and help/advice could be provided for anyone willing to consider this role. At the moment people are doing this approx every 6 weeks, but more people would mean being on duty less often.

Coffee Rota at Chads – a rota of people who arrive early to prepare cups etc and then after the service serve coffee and stay to tidy up kitchen.

**Junior Church at Chads** – Would anyone like to join the team of leaders/helpers working with our children – again on a rota basis. **Sidespeople** – these people arrive early to get books ready for service, welcome people as they arrive, take the offertory, and then at the end of the service stay and help to tidy up (and St Chad's this role involves getting out and putting away chairs) – again a rota of people – more people are especially needed at the 9.30am service.

**Church Cleaning** – The role is different in both churches, but probably requires about an hour of your time once every 6-8 weeks. **Computer Skills** – It would be really helpful to have a small group of people willing to put together and operate a computer during family services (powerpoints during prayer times, video clips for sermons, words for hymns etc.)

**Family Service Planning Group** – We meet for approx 2 hours once a month to put together ideas for the following month's family service. More people would be welcome to increase our ideas base!

**Pastoral Visiting** – We have a small team of people who visit the sick and the housebound. There are always more people who could be visited if we had more volunteers.

#### Gospel Readings: (John 20:19-31)

#### All :Glory to you, O Lord

19When it was evening on the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, 'Peace be with you.' 20After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. 21Jesus said to them again, 'Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you.' 22When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit. 23If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained.'

24But Thomas (who was called the Twin), one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. 25So the other disciples told him, 'We have seen the Lord.' But he said to them, 'Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe.'

26A week later his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, 'Peace be with you.' 27Then he said to Thomas, 'Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe.' 28Thomas answered him, 'My Lord and my God!' 29Jesus said to him, 'Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe.'

30Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book. 31But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name.
