- PCC News At our last meeting, in January, we discussed ways to improve communications. We agreed to look at the design of the weekly newsletter and to investigate putting copies of the magazine in the library and other places in Irby. We had applied for a grant to improve the kitchen at St Chad's, but the amount awarded was a much smaller amount than what we had requested so we decided to investigate doing the work in phases, provided the Local Authority would still provide the grant. We discussed whether we could find other ways to provide much needed facilities at St Bartholomew's, as fund-raising for the Open Door project had become difficult, and that at the next meeting, we would review various possibilities suggested by the Diocese and the Conservation Officer. Finally, we received several ideas for new developments from Mr Robert Preston, a business consultant, about ways to improve our financial position and we will be looking carefully at those over our next few meetings. Our next meeting takes place on February 9th. All the issues from January will be on the agenda, along with other possibilities to

encourage growth in the church and any new issues related to the buildings that the churchwardens may have identified. If any member of the congregations wishes to comment on any of these topics before the meeting, please speak to a member of the PCC.

#### **GOSPEL READING: John 1:1-14**

#### All: Glory to you, O Lord

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. 2He was in the beginning with God. 3All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. 4What has come into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. 5The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it. 6There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. 7He came as a witness to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. 8He himself was not the light, but he came to testify to the light. 9The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world. 10He was in the world, and the world came into being through him; yet the world did not know him. 11He came to what was his own, and his own people did not accept him. 12But to all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God, 13who were born, not of blood or of the will of the flesh or of the will of man, but of God. 14And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth.
