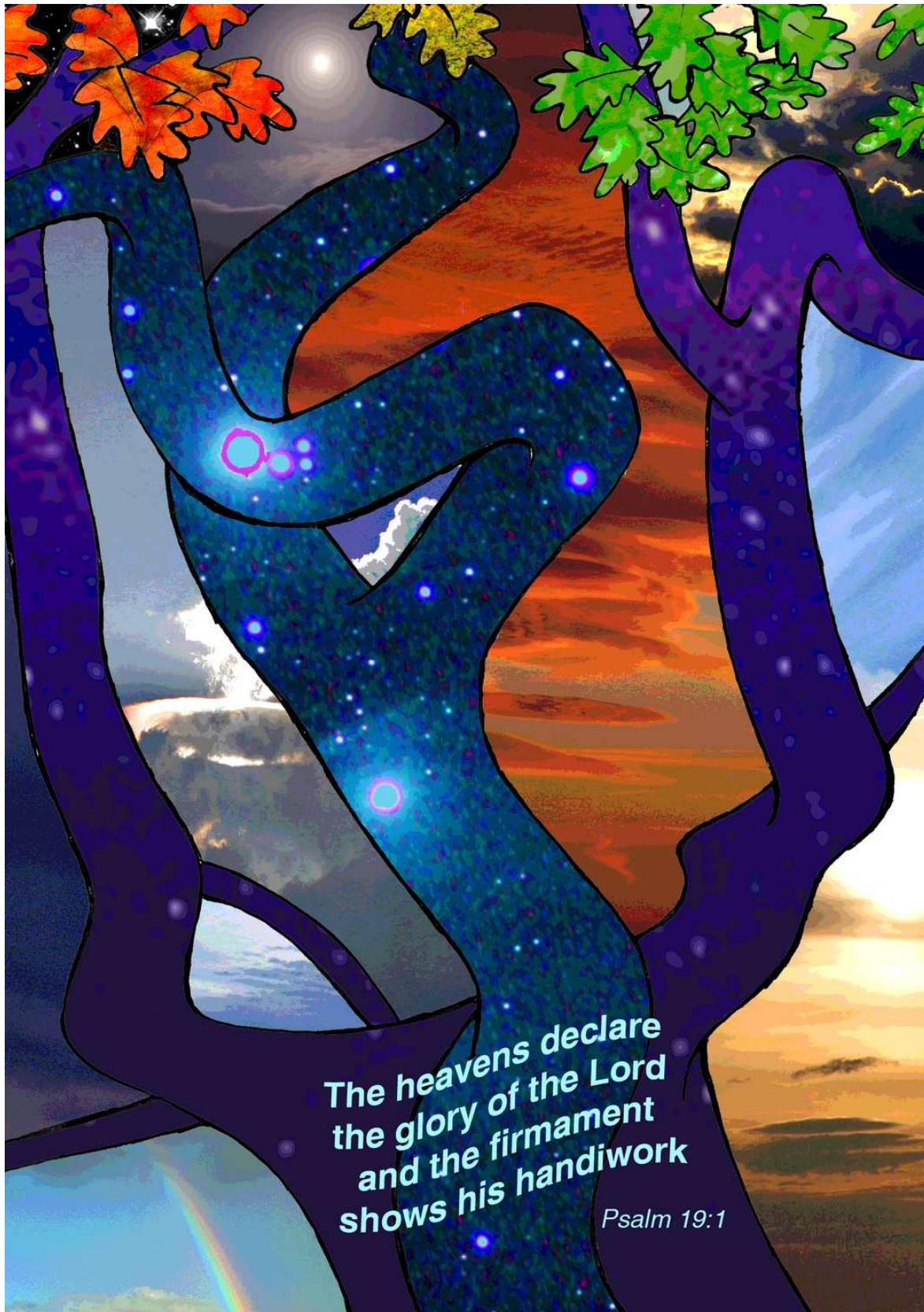

From Your Rector

Dear Friends

15th Anniversary of 9/11

Fifteen years ago on 11th Sept 2001 terrorist attacks demolished the Twin Towers in New York killing 2,996 people and injuring over 6,000. Events like 9/11 raise the inevitable question: Why does God allow such suffering to take place?

There are no easy answers to this question! We cannot fully understand why such things happen, although we live in a fallen world, where people make real choices. Yet the Bible affirms that God identifies with our suffering, supremely when Jesus experienced suffering and death! It is on the cross that God knows what it is to lose a loved one in an unjust attack. 'I could never myself believe in God if it were not for the Cross. In the real world of pain, how could one worship a God who was immune to it?' (John Stott).

What does this mean? We cannot know why God allows evil and suffering to continue, but we do know that he does love or care for us: 'For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life.' (John 3:16). God loved us enough to fully engage with the mess of the world.

Uncertainty and Hope

If the audience at the First Night of the Proms this year had not heard the national news broadcasts that day, they would have been startled by an unscheduled addition to the programme. It opened with a rousing rendition of the French National Anthem.

Scores of unsuspecting holidaymakers in the French resort of Nice had been mown down by a fanatical lorry driver; his was the latest in a chain of massacres perpetrated by Islamists in Europe and beyond. Ironically, it was Bastille Day, commemorating French unity. The playing of the Marseillaise in London's Albert Hall was a demonstration of solidarity with French people everywhere and a defiant message of hope.

Church leaders the world over published their prayers the next day. An Anglican chaplain based near Nice said, "Prayer is the thing. We can't do anything tangible or practical in support of the security service apart from our own vigilance . . . but we do have a very strong and a

very powerful thing that we can do . . . and that is prayer . . . because with faith we trust in God's love and mercy for those who have died, but for the families left behind this is a most terrible time from which many may not recover."

Terrorist acts of this kind are motivated by a deadly combination of false faith with hatred. No one is risk-free, and the nations' leaders are hard-pressed to safeguard their people. St. Paul's advice to Timothy has never been more apt: "I urge that ... prayers... be offered to God for all in authority, that we may live a quiet and peaceful life with all reverence towards God and with proper conduct."

We must be on our guard, but also trust God. In Nice churchyard is the grave of Henry Lyte, the writer of the hymn, Abide with me, which encourages us to disarm our fears by expressing confidence in God's purposes:

"I fear no foe, with thee at hand to bless;
Ills have no weight, and tears no bitterness;
Where is death's sting? Where grave thy victory?
I triumph still, if Thou abide with me."

May you know God's peace and blessing in your lives.

An Invitation

All are invited to the launch of YBible at Chester Cathedral on Thurs. 15th Sept. at 7.30pm.

Dr Peter Oakes (Head of Department, Religions and Theology at Manchester University) will speak on 'The Bible for Real People. Then and Now.' The evening will also include a host of other presentations, resources, and ideas. Variety and mutual encouragement will characterise the event. We hope to generate a host of different responses and ideas so that every congregation will be involved. The aim is to encourage a new enthusiasm for regular use of the Bible in a wide number of ways.

But YBible isn't primarily about big events. Its aim is mutual encouragement in which we help one another with our use of the Bible.



Getting Involved

It is hoped that every congregation will do something under the YBible banner during the course of the year beginning next month. Whether a 'one-off' special gathering, a shared endeavour, group work or a course, or an initiative for individuals, everyone is urged to try something new in their approach to using the Bible.

Scripture Engagement

As one way into that exploration, Dr Phil Collins of Taylor University's Center for Scriptural Engagement has given permission for the Diocese to utilize the methods collected together by that Center. A host of suggestions ranging across memorization, journaling, visual arts, Lectio Divina, praying, singing, hand-copying, storying, speaking, dramatizing, public reading, and more, are detailed on their website. Everything is now available to use through the Bible Gateway website - www.biblegateway.com/resources/scripture-engagement/ The site contains all sorts of imaginative resources to enhance our use of the Scriptures. Why not explore its many possibilities and encourage friends to do the same?

'52 Thoughts'

At the launch a small book of favourite Bible verses will be published as a first YBible effort. The style of the book is personal accounts of why a particular verse of scripture is significant to the author. The key word there is 'personal' since what is being offered isn't an academic or scholarly account but a more individual and heartfelt approach. The purpose is to encourage one another in sharing the power of a word of scripture in a person's own faith experience.

As well as the book, the thoughts will also be published on the diocesan website. They will therefore be widely available for readers' reflection.

Parish initiatives

Reading Luke Together is one initiative to celebrate the YBible Year, encouraging more people to read the Bible for themselves.

Members of each church community will be encouraged to read one portion of Luke's Gospel each day, following a pattern of readings put together by Josie Tuplin, parish Reader at St Saviour's Oxton. It will start in Advent 2016 and end at Easter 2017, which means we'll be reading the Christmas and Easter stories at the corresponding times in the Church Year.

Stef Reid – Christian paralympic athlete on her way to Rio

Stef Reid is a paralympic athlete. She does long-jump and also sprints. In the 2008 Paralympics she won a bronze medal in the 200 metres and in 2012, a silver medal in the long jump. She has broken the world record for long-jump in the F44 (below the knee amputees) class several times.

She had a life-changing accident in her teens as she describes: "I was in a boating accident when I was 16. The propellers caught me across my lower back. The water around me was blood red. I thought I had been cut in half. The next issue was that we were three hours away from a half-decent hospital.

"I survived but unfortunately the leg was so mangled that it had to be amputated. So I was really thankful to be alive. But with my love for sport, I was absolutely devastated. The stuff that you love to do, you are told that you cannot do it any more.

"I don't come from a Christian family but my parents sent me to a Christian school. We had Bible classes. I had a very good head knowledge of the Bible but it wasn't a major part of my life.

"Everything changed when I was in the accident. I remember lying in the ambulance. I was scared because I knew in my heart that I wasn't going to heaven. I did not know God. I had never asked Him what His plan was for my life. I remember praying for a second chance. It was a complete miracle that I survived the accident. I know that God had a hand in that.

"I also know that by me not dying, I still had a purpose here. There is a reason for me to be here and it completely changed my perspective. It changed me as a person and I committed my life to Him in the ambulance. Now, I look at things from the perspective of hope. I have always got hope. I think that is the biggest difference".

In September 2016 Stef will represent Britain in the Paralympics

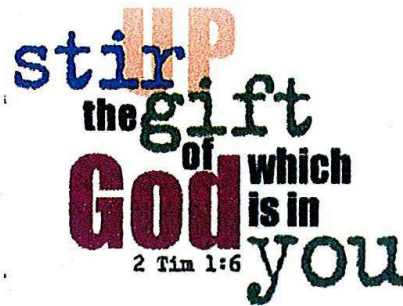

APCM NEWS

Thank you to everyone who attended the APCM on 24th April.

Could you be our Church Warden?



We only received one nomination (Mr Chris Perry), so he was elected!

Church wardens are elected for one year, but can serve up to six consecutive years if re-elected. Mr John Roberts has done that, so he cannot stand again.

The basic number of churchwardens is two for each parish. There is no legal sanction if a parish does not have the full number, but it is important to ensure a full complement if at all possible. This is because a single churchwarden acting alone can be placed under an unreasonable burden. It is also unsatisfactory for a parish to be left without cover if a single churchwarden is unable to carry out his or her duties for a time, for example because of illness or unavoidable absence... Churchwardens are chosen and hold office for only one year at a time. (From the "Guide to the Churchwarden's Measure 2001")

Church Wardens are appointed to serve the whole parish and not a particular church building or congregation and so anyone who is

baptised,
on the electoral roll,
an "actual communicant"
and aged over 21

can be considered for this role.

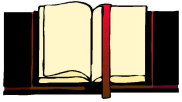

A farmer went out to sow a field of corn.

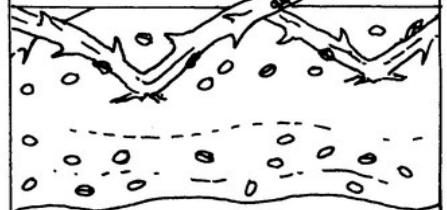


Some seed fell on the path

Some listen gladly...

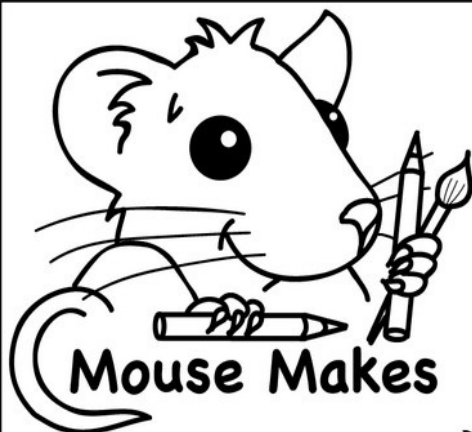
