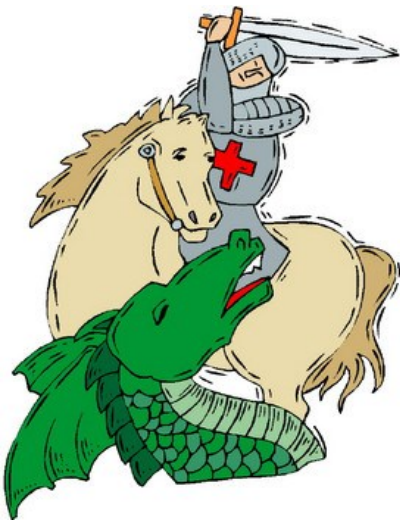

From Your Rector

Dear Friends

Have you seen the film *How to Train your Dragon*? It's set in a Viking village under attack from dragons, who steal livestock and burn down houses. Hiccup, the village Chief's son, invents a machine to capture dragons. However, when he catches one of the most dangerous dragons, he cannot kill it, when he sees that the dragon is just as frightened as he is. Through this friendship, the people and dragons eventually live in harmony.



This month we celebrate St. George, the patron saint of England. He is famous for slaying a dragon, a tradition which became popular in the Middle Ages. Whether he killed an actual dragon is open to question! However, we do know that the original George was a Roman soldier at the time of Emperor Diocletian. He refused to renounce his faith, as commanded by the Emperor, resulting in his death on 23 April 303 AD.

The contrast is clear: St. George slayed the evil dragon, while Hiccup refused to kill one. However, they also have something important in common. Both acted according to their conscience, defying the popular understanding of those around them and not worrying about the personal cost to themselves. St. George was martyred for standing up for his faith in Jesus before a pagan emperor, while Hiccup risked rejection by his father and village because of his compassion.

Today, we are still called to stand for Christ against wrongs and injustice in a daily life, whatever the personal cost. However, we also

need to be ready to look our enemies in the eye and meet their hostility with love and compassion. This is why we also remember this month that Jesus died and rose again, so that we might have God's power to do this in our lives.

**Passion Flower (Passiflora) – Symbol of Christ's Passion and Cross:
including his scourging, crowning with thorns, three nails and five wounds**

In the 15th and 16th centuries, Spanish Christian missionaries adopted the unique physical structures of this plant, particularly the numbers of its various flower parts, as symbols of the last days of Jesus and especially his crucifixion:



- * The pointed tips of the leaves were taken to represent the Holy Lance.
- * The tendrils represent the whips used in the flagellation of Christ.
- * The ten petals and sepals represent the ten faithful apostles (less St. Peter the denier and Judas Iscariot the betrayer).
- * The flower's radial filaments, which can number more than a hundred and vary from flower to flower, represent the crown of thorns.
- * The chalice-shaped ovary with its receptacle represents a hammer or the Holy Grail
- * The 3 stigmata represent the 3 nails and the 5 anthers below them the 5 wounds (four by the nails and one by the lance).
- * The blue and white colours of many species' flowers represent Heaven and Purity.

The Electoral Roll

All Church of England parishes are required to maintain an electoral roll. Those people whose names are on the roll are entitled to attend the Annual Parish Meeting and to vote. They are also eligible for election on to the Parochial Church Council. The number of people on the electoral roll also determines how many representatives can be sent to the Deanery Synod where decisions may be taken that effect the churches within the deanery. It is therefore important that all those eligible should be entered on to electoral roll for this parish of St Bartholomew Thurstaston and St Chad Irby. Although the roll may be updated regularly a new roll has to be created every 6 years and 2013 was the most recent year in which this had to be done.

To be eligible applicants must be 16 years of age or over and
Either Live within the parish boundary or
Or Have been a regular worshipper at St Bartholomew Thurstaston or St Chad Irby for at least 6 months.

Liverpool Overhead Railway

A recent visit to the Museum of Liverpool at the Pier Head brought back childhood memories of the Liverpool Overhead Railway. The museum houses an original coach from the railway which visitors can access and even sit on the hard slatted wooden seats which furnished the carriages.

The Overhead Railway was opened in 1893 and was the first elevated electric railway in the world. Originally, it spanned five miles from Alexandra Dock to Herculaneum Dock, famous for its whaleboats, but it was eventually extended at both ends – to Seaforth and Litherland in the north and to Park Road, Dingle in the south – the latter via a tunnel, the elevated entrance to which can be still seen from the 'Dock Road' which runs from Parliament Street to Otterspool Promenade. The extended line had seventeen stations.

Locally, the railway became known as, The Dockers' Umbrella, because of the protection it afforded its main passengers as they exited the stations and walked towards their dock entrances. The line was featured in the film, *The Clouded Yellow*, when the character played by Jean Simmonds used the railway to travel to one of the docks.

Living close to Herculaneum Dock, I recall using the railway when we made rare visits to the town centre. My father used it to travel each day to Hoylake where he was manager of a fish shop. Mum and I would make our way to the station each evening to meet him from the train. Sometimes, we would stop to view a whaleboat tied up in the dock. The only school trip I recall, apart from a whole school visit in 1953 to the Gaumont Cinema to see a coloured film of the Coronation, was when our teacher, Mr Davies, took the whole top class, single handed, on a journey on the Overhead Railway to Gladstone Dock. On our return, he abandoned us to make our own way home from Dingle Station at the bottom of Park Road, next to the Gaumont Cinema.

The Overhead Railway was finally closed in 1956 because of extensive corrosion to the cast iron supports. It was replaced by the No. 1 bus which had, neither the romanticism, nor the scenic views, of the railway.

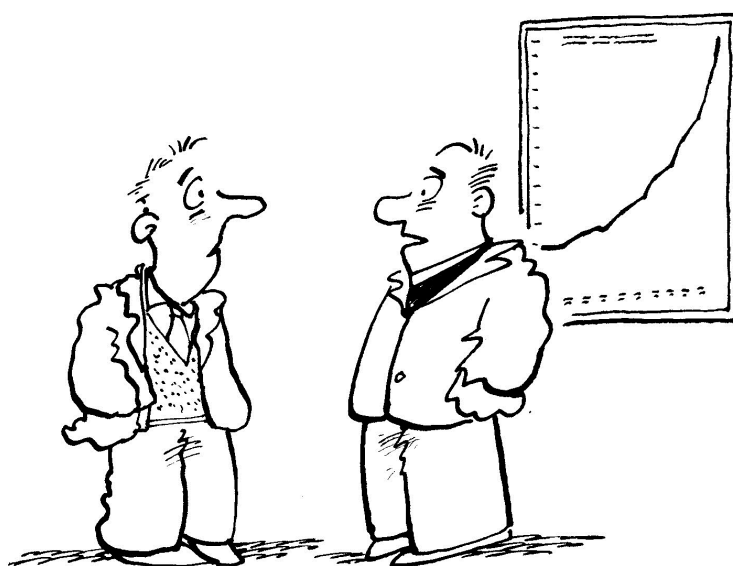

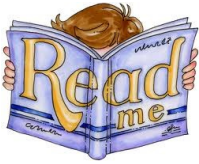

The church will host an evening of fine dining, super entertainment and gracious hostility.

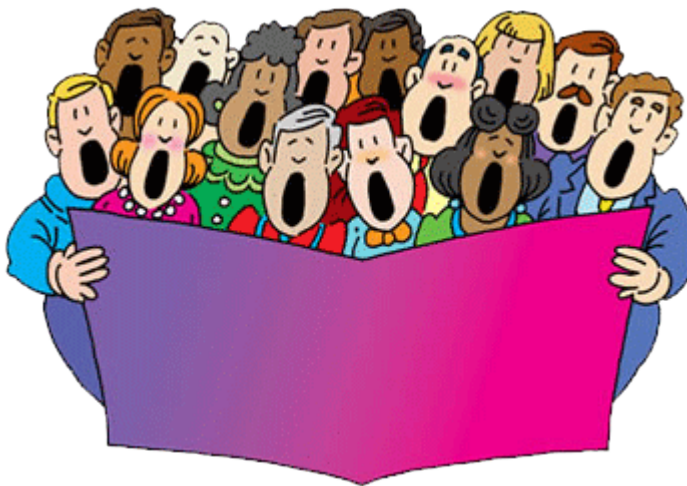
Pot-luck supper Sunday at 5:00 pm - prayer and medication to follow.


