Dear Friends,

Thy Kingdom Come

The Archbishops of Canterbury and York are calling Christians of every denomination to join in with Thy Kingdom Come, a prayer initiative between Ascension and Pentecost (25th May to 4th June), to pray for the nation to know Jesus Christ. It is a time to seek the empowering of the Holy Spirit, that we may be effective witnesses to Jesus Christ.



Praying for others to know Jesus is one of the most powerful things we can do. Persistent prayer for others brings transformation to their lives. As Paul writes: 'Devote yourselves to prayer, being watchful and thankful. And pray for us, too, that God may open a door for our message, so that we may proclaim the mystery of Christ, for which I am in chains. Pray that I may proclaim it clearly, as I should.' (Colossians 4: 2-4).

The Archbishops are encouraging us to choose five people who we can pray for regularly. Why not ask God to guide you, as you settle on five names and commit to praying for them daily, perhaps by using the following prayer:

'Loving Father, in the face of Jesus Christ your light and glory have blazed forth. Send your Holy Spirit that I may share with my friends the life of your Son and your love for all. Strengthen me as a witness to that love as I pledge to pray for them, for your name's sake. Amen.'

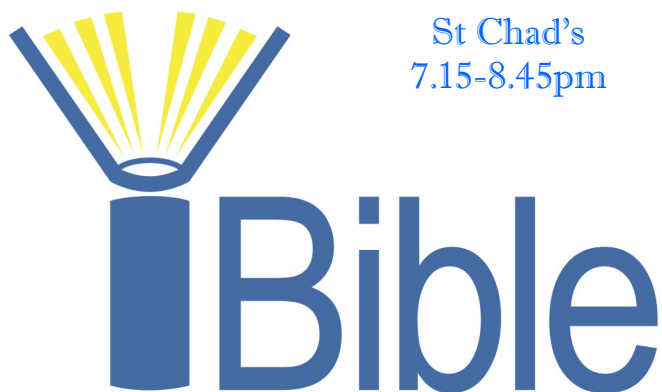

Deadline for cashing in your old £1 coins

Dig into the pockets of your coats, rummage down the backs of your chairs and couch, empty your piggy bank, look in your car – do whatever it takes, but FIND all those old £1 coins that may lurk around your house – before it is too late.

For this autumn, the little round £1 we have known since 1983 will become worthless. The Treasury has just brought out a new 12-sided £1 coin. The change to the new silver and gold dodecagon is the largest to affect the UK's currency since 1998, when the old 50p coin was abandoned for a smaller, shiner version.

The face side of the new £1 coin features the Queen, while the tail side features four emblems: the English rose, the leek for Wales, the Scottish thistle and the shamrock for Northern Ireland – all emerging from a single stem within a crown.

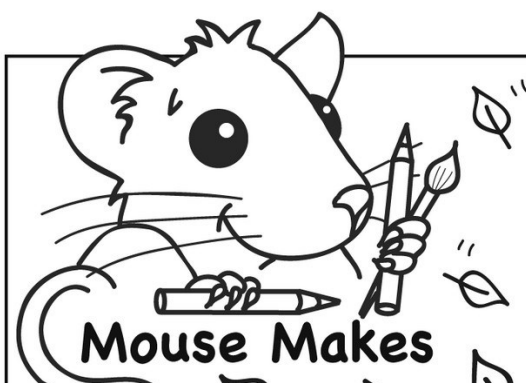

He ran ahead and climbed a tree.

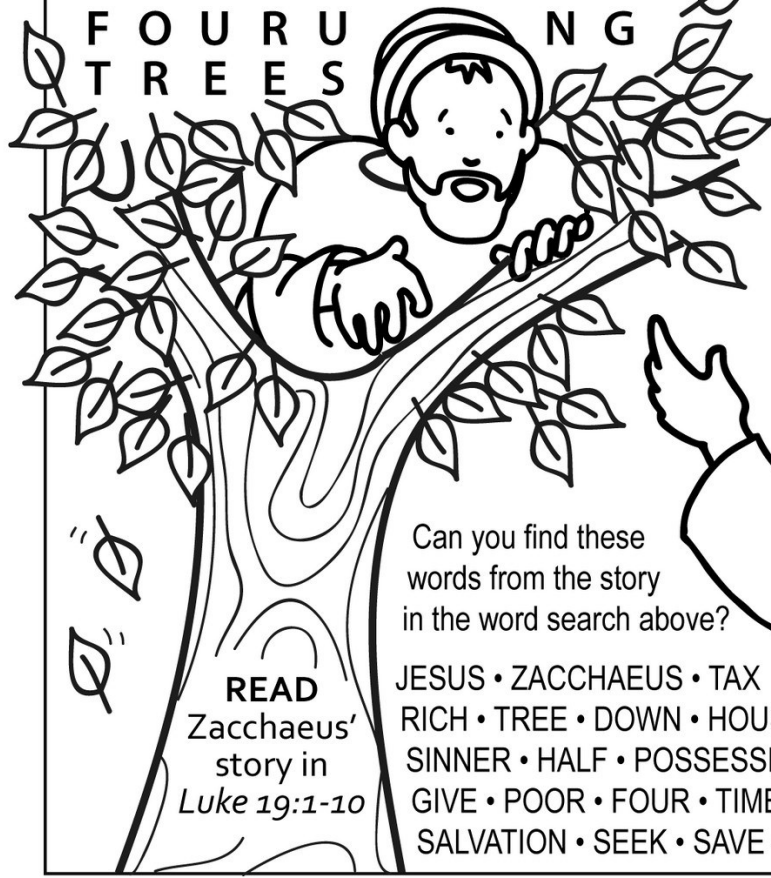
Jesus stopped as he passed by,

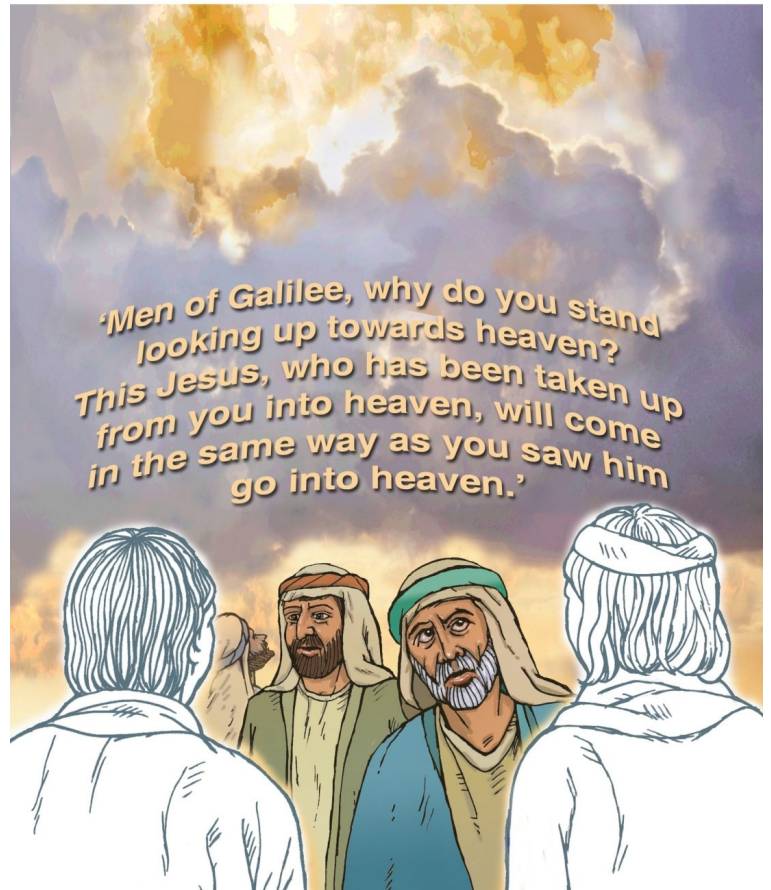

A Strange Farewell

One of the most extraordinary passages in the Bible tells the story of Christ's goodbye, which we call the Ascension:

"While He was blessing them, He parted from them and was carried up into heaven. And they, after worshipping Him, returned to Jerusalem with great joy, and were continually in the temple praising God."



It was the last time the apostles would see Jesus. They had experienced the utter catastrophe of His death, followed within days by the triumph of His resurrection. Later, He left them. Instead of the sadness we might expect after His final farewell, they were exuberant and went back to Jerusalem. What an extraordinary reaction. Jesus had gone, Jerusalem was fraught with danger, yet they seemed brimful with confidence.

Ringling in their ears was His repeated teaching about the Kingdom of God and the commission to preach forgiveness of sins throughout the world, beginning at Jerusalem. They were to wait there until they were "clothed with power from on high." Far from feeling abandoned, they were full of hope and eager to be equipped for their vocation. They and the Christian community would represent Christ on earth, as He represented them in heaven, "seated at the right hand of the Father", in the words of

the Creed

All this is temporary. God has not planned the world to remain in its present state in perpetuity. Our particular era may seem to be particularly grim, but it is but one strand in human history and we are no more distinctive than any other generation. Although the world as it is seems to be lasting a long time, we are living in what the writer of the Letter to the Hebrews calls 'the final age'. We are to anticipate a finale, when Christ's rule will be All this is temporary. God has not planned the world to remain in its present state in perpetuity. There's an Old Testament proverb which is particularly apt: "Many are the plans in a person's heart, but it is the Lord's purpose that prevails." Isn't that exactly what we hope for every time we pray for God's will to be done on earth, as in heaven?

The Archbishop of Canterbury and others are prompting us to join in a global 'wave of prayer' between Ascension and Pentecost (25 May to 4 June), concentrating on "Your Kingdom Come". That will make us usurpers, praying for God's Kingdom to displace all others! It will also make us one with Christ.

But the ultimate award for evasion goes to Jonah. He was called to be a missionary to foreigners whom he detested, so he took off in the opposite direction.

What does God's voice sound like? It sounds exactly like that of a friend or family member, who sees things in you that you can't see yourself. When they ask you if you have considered full-time teaching, or volunteering to be a Street Pastor, or becoming a Vicar, or applying for promotion, or anything else which might be God's will for you, that may be God's voice.

Often it will confirm a thought which you have had yourself. Don't say, "Oh no, I couldn't", because, as we've seen, that's what everyone says and it won't wash. At least we ought to try it out. St Paul wrote, "The one who calls you is faithful", because we won't be abandoned along the way.

7th May is Vocations Sunday in most churches. Here's how the Church of England explains vocation:

"The young are called; the elderly are called. There is no retirement from the Christian pilgrimage.Women are called and men are called.....God 'has no favourites'We are all called no matter what our occupations may be. There's no special status in the Kingdom for those in 'top jobs' or 'important responsibilities'"

HYMNS WITH NORTHERN CONNECTIONS ...

...to add two more to those we looked into some months ago. This time we have CHRIST TRIUMPHANT, EVER REIGNING and ABIDE WITH ME, which we have in both of our Anglican churches in Thurstaston and Irby.

SONGS OF PRAISE on April 9th last, Palm Sunday, had Michael Baughen speaking of YOUTH PRAISE, the book of Hymns, Psalms and Spiritual Songs which he launched with co-contributors in 1966 when he was two years into his Manchester incumbency.

CHRIST TRIUMPHANT was the name he gave to his tune for the hymn of that name, the words of which had been written by Michael Saward.

After serving in a London Parish, Michael Baughen returned north in 1982 to be consecrated Bishop of Chester. In that year, HYMNS FOR TODAY'S CHURCH (HTC) was launched with Michael as its consultant editor.

I was invited by the PCC of Bebington, St. Andrew, to commend the new hymn book, with the help of the organist there, to the church's congregation. I included CHRIST TRIUMPHANT in my selection, set to its new tune, GUITING POWER (named by its composer John Barnard after a village east of Cheltenham and well-known to horse-trainers).

Three dismayed ladies approached me at the close, lamenting what seemed to be the loss of Michael's tune. I was able to assure them that both tunes were in the book. The GUITING POWER tune is the one now widely known in Christian circles.

But I like both, and am so glad when Craig, our organist, plays Michael's original! I love to praise the Lord in the chorus -

“Yours the glory and the crown,
the high renown, th'eternal name.”

ABIDE WITH ME was written by Henry LYTE (1793-1847) who was born near Kelso in the Scottish Borders. As I write, the FA Cup Final looms, and this could well be sung again at Wembley on the day. Just for the record, Henry, though long-departed has descendants living in Irby.

The final verse of this well-loved hymn is a wonderfully personal prayer of Christian faith and hope -

“Hold Thou Thy cross
before my closing eyes;
shine through the gloom,
and point me to the skies; heaven's morning breaks,
and earth's vain shadows flee;
in life, in death, O Lord,
abide with me.”

There we are – hymns for every age in every age!


