From Your Rector

St Andrew the evangelist

'Some people think football is a matter of life and death. I don't like that attitude. I can assure them it is much more serious than that' (Bill Shankley). You can replace the word 'football' with 'mission', and this quote still has something to say! The apostle Andrew (we remember him on November 30th) demonstrates what the mission of the Church is all about (cf John 1:35-42). And it's not unlike following your favourite football team!


When we support a football team, we want to know all about them! When Andrew and his friend heard about Jesus, they wanted to find out more: 'Look, the Lamb of God.' (John the Baptist, v35). The first stage of mission is finding out more about Jesus, the one who enables us to be friends of God through His death and resurrection.


Secondly, when supporting a football team, we want to spend time watching their games. Andrew asked, 'where are you staying?' and Jesus replied 'Come and you will see' (v39). Andrew spent the rest of the day talking and listening to Jesus. As a result of this time he had something to share. How much time do we spend with Jesus, reading His word and praying?

When our team wins, we have good news to share! After meeting Jesus, Andrew's first action was to tell his brother Peter: 'We have found the Messiah' (that is, the Christ)' (v41). Are we willing to tell others about Him too? Sharing with family and close friends can sometimes be harder than talking with strangers. However, we don't need to follow a football team to engage in mission. It's all about being excited to share Jesus will those we meet day by day.

'Preach the Gospel everywhere, use words if necessary' (St Francis of Assisi).

Film review of The Shack, by Andrew Maclean at The Christian Film Review:-

The Shack is the highly anticipated, big screen interpretation of the best selling book of the same name. Protagonist 'Mack' played by Sam Worthington goes through the horror of losing his youngest daughter during a camping trip. She disappears and her body is never found. Just a bloodied dress in a shack high in the woods.

The family is torn apart in the aftermath of this tragedy and Mack pushed yet further from an already distant God he seems to barely believe in.

Some time later Mack is called back to 'The Shack' via a mysterious letter which appears in his letterbox.

What follows is a fantastical journey of a man finding his way out of the smothering depths of sorrow and into the bosom of God.

By Christian film standards this was a high budget film at \$20 million. This money is apparent from the wonderful cast to the captivating visual effects. The script treads a delicate line between the horror of child abduction and murder and any temptation towards saccharine sweet Christian answers to such horrors. Just as you think the film is going to be cutsie it swerves back into authenticity.

Academy award winner Octavia Spencer plays 'Papa' (God) with a genuine kindness and affection. Jesus (Avraham Aviv Alush) is open and funny and a friend while Sam Worthington's Mack is honest and broken.

The film feels like a Christian weekend away. You meet friends, grow close and feel changed by the process in a really short time. The film addresses hard hitting subjects and asks how we can forgive the unforgivable. It asks the audience to look where they need to forgive and pulls their heart strings enough to make them cry but not enough to make them shrug with cynicism.

Some will struggle with the theology but the message of God's unreserved love and forgiveness will reach down into the depths of the audience. The pre-screening audience wept throughout.

I honestly feel this is the best Christian film since The Passion of The Christ.

Two Minutes Silence

In the month, when we think about those who have given their lives in war, the two minutes silence is a familiar act of remembrance. We can use the silence to reflect on those who have suffered in war or on what it means to work for a peaceful world. Or do we end up thinking about lunch or panic that we haven't switched our phone off?

Victor Frankl, a victim of Auschwitz, suggested that the most intolerable of all human conditions is not imprisonment or hunger, but lack of meaning. The two minutes silence enables us to connect with Jesus' message, which offers true meaning to our lives and world. He spoke of giving ourselves in love for each other and the world, 'Love your enemies and pray for those that persecute you' (Matthew 5:44). He also demonstrated such love in sacrificing His own life, 'Greater love has no-one than this, that he lay down his life for his friends' (John 15:13). In observing the silence, let's use it to reflect on this sacrificial love, as we remember all those who have experienced pain and conflict.

Of course, we should be serious about silence and stillness in the whole of our lives, not just for two minutes at an act of Remembrance. In busy lives where so much is clamouring for our attention, silence enables us to reassess our priorities and rediscover true meaning in our lives. Jesus made a habit of withdrawing to experience silence. He did this before choosing his disciples, after He heard of John's beheading, after feeding the 5000, after healing a leper, at the Transfiguration and to prepare for His death. 'The seeking out of solitary places was a regular practice for Jesus. So it should be for us.' (Richard Foster).

First Service of Remembrance

The theme for this year's 10.15 a.m. Service of Remembrance is, *Letters from the Front*. It is often in the letters sent home by serving men and women in the Armed Forces that we learn, most vividly, of the bravery, sacrifice and loss that goes hand in hand with war. During our worship, we will hear letters written from the front line by servicemen to their loved ones back home.

One of the letters was written by Noel Chavasse, son of a former Bishop of Liverpool and the only man to be twice awarded the Victoria Cross for bravery during the First World War. A qualified doctor, Noel served in the Royal Army Medical Corps of the King' Regiment in Flanders. In addition to the letter to be used in our service, Noel wrote a number of letters home describing the horrors of war. Below is a letter he wrote home on 15th June 1915.

As we carried our stuff to the trenches we had to pass through a little copse. It was about 11 p.m. and in the copse a nightingale sang most sweetly. This was most remarkable because bullets were spattering through the trees all the time and frequently shells burst quite near so that its song was drowned. But it did not mind and continued singing all the time. It sings every night and I love to hear it.

When we got to our dug-outs we found we had a hot spot because they are played upon by a machine gun. We found this out to our cost two days ago because as one of my poor stretcher-bearers was chopping up some wood to boil some tea the Maxim gun suddenly let off and a little shower of bullets kicked up the earth all round him. One bullet pierced his head and he dropped unconscious. He lived still when we put him onto the ambulance, but we hear he died on the way to hospital.

I have now had 4 stretcher-bearers killed and one wounded, and one has had to go home with a strained heart and another because his nerves gave way after a very bad shelling. That is 7 out of 16 already. Last night I had a bad but necessary job. I had to crawl out behind part of the trench and bury three poor Englishmen who had been killed by a shell. I am going out after another tonight. This is the seamy side of war, but all is repaired in the feeling of comradeship and friendship made out here. It is a fine life and a man's job, but I think I shall be glad to get home again.

Noel was killed in August 1917, the third anniversary of the outbreak of the First World War. He is buried in the New Military Cemetery at Brandhoek, a small village just west of Ypres. His headstone is the only one in the world to have two Victoria Crosses engraved upon it.

THE BISHOP OF CHESTER

Dear Colleagues,

Ad Clerum

You will doubtless have heard that there has been a police investigation into allegations of improper sexual behaviour by Victor Whitsey (Bishop of Chester 1974-81).

The police have reported the outcome of their investigation, as well as making a public statement about the conclusions they have reached. As you can understand, from recent news, when the accused is dead there is only so far that the police can progress matters. The police have advised that were Bishop Victor alive, they would wish to question him under caution in relation to 10 complainants. The Archbishop of York and I have issued a joint statement of apology and regret for any unacceptable behaviour which occurred. This can be found on the Diocesan website.

The Police have indicated there are no further steps which they can take. The Church, through the national safeguarding office, will now conduct a review of these matters, and the Church's handling of them. I never met Victor Whitsey, who died in 1987, but many people in the Diocese (and beyond) will recall him. If anyone has further information which they wish to offer, they are asked to contact either our DSA, Pauline Butterfield (Pauline.butterfield@chester.anglican.org; Church House, 5500 Daresbury Park, Daresbury WA4 4GE; 01928 718834 ext 221) or the CCPAS helpline 0303 003 1111.

I need hardly say that I have been appalled, and shocked, at these allegations. I knew nothing of them until the recent investigation. It is the worst church matter that I have dealt with during my ministry. I would assure you that I am satisfied that the police investigation has been undertaken with great care and professionalism.

Please share the contents of this letter with your parishioners, as you feel is appropriate.


