From Your Rector

Dear Friends,

I hope that you will be able to take part in celebrating the birth of Jesus with us at some of our services throughout December.

The nativity scene with all its characters was in place, as the children (representing angels), gathered around the manger. They sang: 'Glory to God in the highest and on earth peace, good will among men'. Suddenly a small girl on the edge of the crowd, who couldn't see what was going on, shouted out, 'Let Jesus show!'

At Christmas time, we want to let Jesus show, in our churches, communities and lives. We have an amazing message to share: 'in the town of David a Saviour has been born to you; He is the Messiah, the Lord' (Luke 2:10). It was to the shepherds, apart from his parents, that Jesus was first showed.

No doubt these simple shepherds would have no idea of what the names given to Jesus fully meant (ie Saviour, Messiah and Lord). All they needed to know, and all we need to know, is that God has done something unique in coming to earth as a human being. This is good news of great joy for everybody!

After worshipping the child, the shepherds return to their normal routine. However, they would never be the same again! Even though their work and social standing were unchanged, they had a message to share and let Jesus show. Although we don't normally see angels, we have the same good news to share! When Christmas is over and we're back to our normal routines, how will we let Jesus show in our lives?

Jesus' birth

There are four accounts of Jesus' life in the Bible, but only two of them describe events before He was 30. They are called the Gospel of Matthew and the Gospel of Luke, and they were written about 30 to 40 years after Jesus' death. It may have been that the eyewitnesses were dying out, and it became important to record how Jesus was born. The authors researched the recollections of those who knew and followed Jesus.

The writers also knew the Jewish scriptures (known to Christians as the Old Testament). The scriptures had led the Jews to expect a unique leader called the Messiah or Christ (the words mean the same - 'The Anointed One'). The writings foresaw that this Christ would be associated with the ancestral line of the greatest king in Israel's history, David; with David's birthplace, Bethlehem; and with a virgin whose first child would be named Emmanuel (which means 'God is with us'). Jesus' family home, however, was Nazareth, which was 70 miles away, and his parents were known to be named Joseph and Mary.

By bringing these facts together, Luke created an account in which the young Mary, engaged to Joseph but not yet married, was visited in Nazareth by Gabriel, an angel. Gabriel told her that she had been chosen by God to give birth to a son. The baby would be conceived through a unique act of God. Through this child, God would live among His people in an unprecedented way. She was to call Him Jesus (which means, 'God saves us'). Mary was spared the disgrace associated with being pregnant and unmarried at that time because Joseph acted in a compassionate way. She gave birth in Bethlehem because that was where Joseph's ancestors lived, and he needed to register there in a census.

Matthew's version of this story stresses the fact that Jesus' mission had no national boundaries. He records a visit by foreign academics ('wise men'), who were drawn to the place through their study of sciences and astrology. Luke's gospel continually stresses Jesus' care for marginalised people, and it is appropriate that he records Jesus being visited by local riff-raff (shepherds, guided to Jesus' birthplace by a vision of angels).

In Matthew's version, tragedy overshadowed these events. Herod the Great had been installed in Jerusalem as 'King of the Jews' by the governing Roman authorities. He heard rumours of the birth of a rival, and tried to eliminate the threat by having male children in Bethlehem murdered. However, his soldiers arrived too late to harm Jesus, whose family had fled to Egypt.

Christians remember these events with great celebration at Christmas. Many fables and traditions have accumulated around the bare facts known about Jesus' birth.



GOODBYE CHRISTOPHER ROBIN

Comfort in our troubles

'His childhood was sacrificed to make other childhoods better' says Will Tilston about the title character he plays in *Goodbye Christopher Robin*.

This is the latest film providing a surprising back-story to a popular children's book. But unlike *Saving Mr. Banks*, *Miss Potter* and *Finding Neverland* (which primarily focus on the mind of the writer) *Goodbye Christopher Robin* also shows the impact on the story's main character, who is a real person – the author's eight-



year-old son. This young boy has been experiencing the pain of living with emotionally disengaged parents. His father is shell-shocked from the First World War, and finds it difficult to express his feelings. His mother cannot properly attach to her son because she is convinced that another such war is inevitable and he will be called up to fight, so she showers him with affection one minute and ignores him the next.

Then, in a magical few days when Christopher is alone with his father in the woods surrounding their Sussex house, the two of them bond together through imaginary stories about a group of toy animals. Christopher's father is A. A. Milne, who writes these down as the tales of Winnie-the-Pooh, and the whole family finds themselves swept up in the success of the books. But young Christopher Robin cannot stay little forever.



As he grows, these childhood stories make his adolescent life a misery.


We can't detail the end of the film without spoilers but can highlight that, in the final scenes, we discover that the tales of Winnie-the-Pooh, which had comforted the young boy, became comforting to others in their own distress. Perhaps, as we watch this powerful and moving film, we might reflect on the biblical message that God 'comforts us in all our troubles, so that we

can comfort those in any trouble with the comfort we ourselves receive.'


Film Night @ St Chad's 7.30pm Friday 19th January 2018
