




From Your Rector

Dear Friends,

'For God so loved the world that He gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have eternal life.' (John 3:16)

This verse has been described as 'the greatest verse in the Bible', as it enables us to understand the events of Good Friday and Easter Day.

God's love is unconditional: God demonstrated the extent of His love by sending His Son into this world, to show us what it looks like: 'God with skin on'! God graciously loves us, as none of us deserves it. 'There is nothing we can do to make God love us more. There is nothing we can do to make God love us less.' (Philip Yancey).

God's love is sacrificial: The cross is the supreme demonstration of God's love, as Jesus identifies with a fallen, suffering world. He died for our sins, removing the barrier between us and God, giving access into God's presthe power and release from sin ence of and death. God's love is accessible: Jesus' resurrection makes His eternal life available to all who put their trust in Him. It's an offer of life with purpose, in which we can know God personally, both now and for eternity.

Bobby Moore described receiving the World Cup from the Queen in 1966 as terrifying: 'I noticed that the Queen was wearing some beautiful white gloves. I looked down at my hands and they were completely covered with mud'! Although we approach God with dirty and spoilt lives, by the cross and resurrection, we can shake hands with a holy God.




The Fourth Sunday in Lent was called 'Mid-Lent' or 'Refreshment Sunday', when the rigors of Lent were relaxed more than was normal for a feast day. It is called Mothering Sunday as a reference to the Epistle reading for the Day (Galatians 4:21-31). The Lenten Epistles follow from each other with teaching about our life as Christians and how we are to follow Christ.


On Mid-Lent Sunday the Epistle talks of bondage and freedom; the bondage of the Law and the Old Covenant as compared to the freedom in Christ, "the promised one", and the New Covenant. Verse 26 reads "But Jerusalem which is above is free, which is the mother of us all." We gain our freedom from Christ and, as it was seen before the Reformation, the Church.

Thus, Mothering Sunday is about the freedom that we gain through the promise of Jesus Christ delivered through our Mother the Church. People were encouraged to go to their 'Mother Church' (their home church or their home Cathedral) to worship and give thanks. Hence apprentices, and others, went home for the weekend and often brought gifts (or accumulated pay) home to their family.

On the other hand, Mother's Day is a secular festival invented in 1904 and is celebrated on the 2nd Sunday in May in most countries in the world. The UK seems to be the exception. In recent years Mothering Sunday has been hijacked to take the place of a special, secular day to give thanks for our mothers.

Chester Mystery Plays

A rare and treasured part of Britain's cultural heritage, the Chester Mystery Plays are returning to the diocese this summer to be performed by a community cast of hundreds of actors, singers, musicians and children.

Produced once every five years, the tales of ambition, intrigue, betrayal and passion, drawn from iconic Bible stories, are guaranteed to enrapture, astound and delight.

Originally written by Benedictine monks at the Abbey of St Werburgh (now Chester Cathedral), a new script has been commissioned for 2018 from awardwinning writer Deborah McAndrew, whose recent play Dirty Laundry for Claybody Theatre was given national acclaim.

Director Peter Leslie Wild, who directed the previous cycle in 2013 said: "The

Chester Mystery Plays are such an important part of the city's heritage and being part of them, whether as an actor, a musician, a props maker or helping out front of house, is an experience not to be missed."

The Chester Mystery Plays will be performed in the nave of Chester Cathedral from June 27 July 14 2018. Usually performed in and around the cathedral this is only the second time that they have been produced in the nave, following the success of 2013.

Performances are every evening at 7.30pm with a matinee at 1pm on each Saturday.

MEETING OF PARISHIONERS AND ANNUAL PAROCHIAL CHURCH MEETING

All parishioners are invited to two meetings on Monday 16th April at St Chad's at 6.30 pm, when members of the congregations will be appointed as churchwardens, members of the Parochial Church Council (PCC), members of the Deanery Synod and sidespersons.

The Meeting of Parishioners

The only business during the Meeting of Parishioners is to elect churchwardens. Anyone who lives in the parish can vote. The Rector must receive nominations for churchwardens on the proper forms before the meeting begins. Nominations may not be made after the meeting has begun.

Churchwardens are elected for a year and are legally officers of the bishop. They work closely with the Rector in reporting any issues, particularly in relation to the buildings or church grounds, to her and the PCC.

The Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM)

The PCC is responsible for maintaining the churchyard, the buildings and their contents. Deanery Synod members represent the parish at Synod meetings. Sidespersons (sometimes called churchwarden's assistants) help with the arrangements at services. During the meeting, we can elect people to all these roles. We shall also receive written reports on what the PCC discussed in 2017, the church accounts and the organisations associated with the church.

Sidespersons' names are displayed in the churches on the duty rotas. Anyone who has any interest in becoming more involved in helping with church activities should speak as soon as possible to the Rector, the Honorary Secretary or to any PCC member. Everyone can offer something – do not be put off just because you think you don't know enough about it. PCC members are elected for three years, with five members retiring each year. This year, Jon Oliver, Chris Williams, Roger Jackson, Matt James and Roger Dennison reach the ends of their terms of office but may be re-elected until 2021. There are five other vacancies, four to serve for one year until 2019 and one to serve for two years until 2020.


The current three-year term of office of our Deanery Synod representatives ends in 2020. At present, Malcolm Studholme and Chris Smale represent us and there is one vacancy.

That means that that we can appoint up to ten PCC members, including the five whose term of office expires in April and one person to the Deanery Synod. We are hoping for new members who can bring fresh ideas and insights to our discussions and decisions.

Notices will be displayed in both churches with more details of the meetings, and with nomination forms for PCC members, deanery synod representatives and churchwardens.

Finally, if there are any matters that you wish to bring forward for discussion, please inform the Rector or the Honorary Secretary before the meeting.

ANNUAL MEETING OF PARISHIONERS

Approval of Minutes of Previous Meeting (24th April 2016)

The minutes had been published in the March magazine and copies were available at the meeting. Mrs P Hulme, seconded by Mrs S Turnbull, proposed that they be accepted as a true and accurate record. This was agreed unanimously.

Election of Churchwardens

Mr C Perry had been nominated by Mr C Smale, seconded by Mr R Jackson, and Mrs E Whitehead had been nominated by Mr B Jones, seconded by Mr A Peat. There being no other candidates, both were declared elected.

ANNUAL PAROCHIAL CHURCH MEETING

Approval of Minutes of Previous Meeting (24th April 2016)

The minutes had been published in the March magazine and copies were available at the meeting. Mrs P Hulme, seconded by Mrs S Turnbull, proposed that they be accepted as a true and accurate record. This was <u>agreed unanimously</u>.

Approval of the following Reports published in the Annual Report

- i) Churchwarden's Report on the Fabric, Goods and Ornaments of the Churches Mr Perry added his thanks to the Rector, Mr Turnbull and Others and welcomed Mrs Whitehead as a churchwarden.

- iv) The Junior Church
- v) The St Chad's Seniors

Mr J Óliver, seconded by Mr D Reid, proposed acceptance of the five reports. The proposal was <u>agreed unanimously</u>.

Approval of the Reports on Charities supported throughout the year

- i) The Leprosy Mission
- ii) The Children's Society 12

Approval of Reports on Church Activities

- i) Wellspring Report
- ii) Bellringers' Report

Dr P Robson, Tower Captain, said that the safety rails referred to in the report had been installed. The costs, over £1,000 so far, had been met by the bell ringers from the fees they receive from weddings. This and other improvements had made access to the bell chamber much safer. He thanked the bell ringers for their generosity.

Approval of Other Reports published in the Annual Report and relating to Parish Organisations

Mrs B Appleyard, seconded by Mrs J Bibby, proposed the acceptance of all the reports listed under c – e above. The proposal was <u>agreed</u> <u>unanimously</u>.

Report on Safeguarding Arrangements in the Parish

A change in regulations required the inclusion in the Annual Report of information about the policies for safeguarding children and vulnerable adults. The PCC had appointed a new Safeguarding Officer, Mrs Kathryn Timmins, who had reviewed the policy and procedures. A copy of her proposed policy was available for inspection.

Report by the Treasurer on the Financial Affairs of the Parish during 2016

Mr Turnbull informed the meeting that he had undertaken the role of Honorary Treasurer in June 2016. Many people had supported him. The church would not survive without volunteer help and 11 people were involved in the financial processes, to different degrees. He thanked them all, and also thanked Mr A Whelen, who had inspected the accounts and corrected them where necessary. He said that the accounts had been produced in Receipts and Payments format, which differed from the accruals method used previously. Overall giving had fallen by about 10%, so gift aid had fallen by about the same amount. Income from hire of St Chad's had increased and in future we would be able to let the extension. The cost of work in the churchyard had increased considerably and an application had been submitted for a grant to pay the costs of replacing the roof of St Bartholomew's. It might be necessary to spend more on St Chad's, for example on redecoration. There was a possibility of a Planned Giving campaign later this year. Dr Robson said that legacies appeared to distort the figures,

making it more difficult to compare 2016 and 2015. Mr Turnbull said that this was one of the changes resulting from the change to receipts and payments format.

The Rector thanked Mr Turnbull for the many hours of work he had undertaken to understand the accounting systems and produce the accounts. The parish was extremely grateful for all he had done. This was endorsed with warm applause from all present.

Approval of the Independently Examined Accounts for 2016

Dr Robson, seconded by Mrs Whitehead, proposed the approval of the independently inspected annual accounts for 2016 and the proposal was <u>agreed unanimously</u>.

Appointment of an Independent Examiner of the Accounts for 2017

Mrs Deboorder, seconded by Mrs Appleyard, proposed the appointment of Mrs P Brady as the Independent Examiner of the accounts for 2017. This was <u>approved unanimously</u>. Mr Turnbull noted that Mrs Brady was qualified to be an Independent Examiner but not an Auditor. If our annual income exceeded £250,000 we would require an auditor, and the grant for the roof might cause that to happen.

Report on Matters discussed by the Deanery Synod during 2016

Dr Robson, seconded by Mrs Oliver, proposed acceptance of the report. That was <u>agreed unanimously</u>.

Election of three members of the congregations to represent the parish at the Deanery Synod until 2020

Mr Perry, seconded by Mr Jackson, proposed the reappointment of Mr Smale, and Mr Bradshaw, seconded by Miss Rodgers, proposed the reappointment of Mr Studholme. No other representatives were proposed and Mr Smale and Mr Studholme were <u>declared re-elected</u>.

Election of members of the congregations to membership of the PCC

The Rector thanked Mrs Preston, who had retired, for her contributions and the work she had done. With the appointment of Mrs Whitehead as churchwarden, eight vacancies were to be filled. Five nominations had been received, so all were automatically appointed. Their names, followed by the names of those who proposed and seconded their appointment, were: Mr G Barley (Mrs Deboorder and Mrs Trigg), Mrs J Trigg (Mr Oliver and Mrs Deboorder), Mrs J Deboorder (Mrs Trigg and Mr Oliver), Mrs E Kavanagh (Mrs Whitehead and Mrs Turner) and Mrs J Parmenter (Mrs Cramond and Mrs Deboorder). As Mrs Parmenter had not been on the electoral roll for six months, it was agreed that she would be co-opted.

Appointment of Sidespersons

All serving sidespeople were re-appointed unanimously. The Rector said that more were needed for St Chad's.

Other Business

There was none.

Rector's closing remarks

The Rector thanked everyone for their support during the year. She had been on sabbatical from January to March and was grateful to those who had kept the parish thriving in that time. It had been a challenging year in many ways, especially with bereavements and some disagreeable tasks. She was pleased to have two church wardens again and hoped that 2017 would be better.

The meeting closed with the Grace at 7.15 pm.



The Electoral Roll

All Church of England parishes are required to maintain an electoral roll. Those people whose names are on the roll are entitled to attend the Annual Parish Meeting and to vote. They are also eligible for election on to the Parochial Church Council. The number of people on the electoral roll also determines how many representatives can be sent to the Deanery Synod where decisions may be taken that effect the churches within the deanery. It is therefore important that all those eligible should be entered on to electoral roll for this parish of St Bartholomew Thurstaston and St Chad Irby. Although the roll may be updated regularly a new roll has to be created every 6 years and 2013 was the most recent year in which this had to be done.

To be eligible applicants must be 16 years of age or over and *Either* Live within the parish boundary or

Or Have been a regular worshipper at St Bartholomew Thurstaston or St Chad Irby for at least 6 months.
