From Your Rector

Dear Friends,

The Easter season never ceases to amaze me and have an impact upon my spiritual life. As we read through the post resurrection appearances of Jesus and see the transformation of the disciples as they are commissioned by Jesus (Matthew 28:19-20) and set up a community of believers that we would recognise today as the church (Acts 2:42), I am always challenged by the transformation that takes place. Think of Peter who went from denial of knowing Jesus to becoming an amazing preacher. Think of Thomas who went from disbelief to declaration of faith. The question which this raises for me is what difference does Jesus make in my life? What kind of disciple am I?

I was reminded this week of a quote by the theologian Dietrich Bonhoeffer:-

"Cheap grace is the grace we bestow on ourselves. Cheap grace is the preaching of forgiveness without requiring repentance, baptism without church discipline, Communion without confession...Cheap grace is grace without discipleship, grace without the cross, grace without Jesus Christ, living and incarnate."

If you want to explore what discipleship means in your life, then please join with me and others on Thursday evenings as we explore together the letter of James.

This month we have three major festivals and I would encourage you to make them as much of a priority in your spiritual life as you do Christmas and Easter.

- Ascension Day (Thursday 10th May - service at 7.30pm at St Bartholomew's) is when we remember the resurrected Jesus returning to heaven to take his rightful place as Lord and King. This day is best summed up for me in the word of the hymn "Jesus is King" (see next page)



- Pentecost (Sunday 20th May - services at normal times) when we remember the gift of the Holy Spirit being poured out upon the disciples. The Holy Spirit is the gift of God that lives in us and enables us to know God. She assures us of God's love and acceptance in our lives, despite our fears, doubts or failures:

'God's love has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit, who has been given to us' (Romans 5:5). The Holy Spirit is also committed to producing the character of Jesus in us, 'the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control.' (Galatians 5:22,23).

- Trinity Sunday (Sunday 27th May - services at normal times) is when we remember the awesome mystery of one God who is three persons - Father, Son and Holy Spirit.



It is my heart's desire that each one of us will know in the depth of our being that we are loved by God, as demonstrated by Jesus, and will be open to inviting the Holy Spirit to fill our lives afresh.



Forgiveness and restoration

It is clearly coincidental, but perhaps providential, that *Paddington 2* was released whilst the media has been driving the #MeToo hashtag. We continually read new salacious stories revealing people's hidden depths of wickedness, with an implicit expectation that we should now vilify and exclude them. Then, along came *Paddington 2*, with its heart-warming story of a little bear who looks for the hidden depths of goodness in vilified and excluded people, with the explicit expectation that they should be recognised as part of the society which we all share.



The film's storyline is simple, but beautifully developed. Paddington is working hard as an accident-prone window cleaner to earn enough money to buy a pop-up book from an antiques shop to give to his aunt for her birthday. However, the book contains a secret message about the location of hidden treasure, and the villainous Phoenix Buchanan (Hugh Grant) steals it away. Wrongly convicted of Buchanan's crime, Paddington is sent to prison, where he faces the violent Knuckles McGinty (Brendan Gleeson).

Many children's films operate at two levels: obvious visual slapstick for young viewers, and subtle verbal humour for adults. *Paddington 2* has a much more connected integrity, with an underlying message for young and old. As much as many of us have been hurt, in different ways, by the wicked behaviour of other people, there is good in everyone. And, as much as evil within people's hearts must be recognised and repented, the goal must be forgiveness and restoration. Many films utilise a redemptive story-arc for key characters. *Paddington 2* applies this to everyone. And, thereby, has an important message for us all.

Chester Mystery Plays

A rare and treasured part of Britain's cultural heritage, the Chester Mystery Plays are returning to the diocese this summer to be performed by a community cast of hundreds of actors, singers, musicians and children.

Produced once every five years, the tales of ambition, intrigue, betrayal and passion, drawn from iconic Bible stories, are guaranteed to enrapture, astound and delight.

Originally written by Benedictine monks at the Abbey of St Werburgh (now Chester Cathedral), a new script has been commissioned for 2018 from award-winning writer Deborah McAndrew, whose recent play *Dirty Laundry* for Claybody Theatre was given national acclaim.

Director Peter Leslie Wild, who directed the previous cycle in 2013 said: "The

Chester Mystery Plays are such an important part of the city's heritage and being part of them, whether as an actor, a musician, a props maker or helping out front of house, is an experience not to be missed."

The Chester Mystery Plays will be performed in the nave of Chester Cathedral from June 27 July 14 2018. Usually performed in and around the cathedral this is only the second time that they have been produced in the nave, following the success of 2013.

Performances are every evening at 7.30pm with a matinee at 1pm on each Saturday.
