




From Your Rector

Dear Friends

I spent much of the Summer thinking about the way in which God blesses me. I was particularly struck by Psalm 67, from which I preached on 20th August. Below is an illustration that I used in that sermon, which I acquired from some daily bible reading notes that I had "squirreled away".

As a minister was addressing a group of men, he took a large piece of paper and made a black dot in the centre of it with a marking pen. Then he held the paper up before the group and asked them what they saw. One person quickly replied, "I see a black mark." "Right," the preacher replied. "What else do you see?" Complete silence prevailed. "Don't you see anything other than the dot?" he asked. A chorus of no's came from the audience. "I'm really surprised," the speaker commented. "You have completely overlooked the most important thing of all—the sheet of paper." Then he made the application. He said that in life we are often distracted by small, dot-like disappointments or painful experiences, and we are prone to forget the innumerable blessings we receive from the hand of the Lord. But like the sheet of paper, the good things are far more important than the adversities that monopolize our attention.

This reminds me of a bit of verse which, though I admit is somewhat trite, does express good practical advice. Someone has written: "As you travel down life's pathway, may this ever be your goal: Keep your eye upon the doughnut, and not upon the hole!"





'He gave us eyes to see them': Caravaggio's Matthew in the Contarelli

21st September is the feast day of St Matthew the evangelist, and his call by Jesus is described without any embellishment in chapter 9 of his Gospel. It was a bold step for Jesus to call a tax collector, someone so hated by the people. And it was an equally bold step for Matthew to respond – to turn from the security and profit of his lifestyle and step out into the unknown.

It is the subject of one of three paintings on Matthew's life that produced Caravaggio Contarelli for the Chapel of the church of San Luigi in Rome in 1560. The group of tax collectors are their daily about routine of counting Thev are money. dressed in rich 16th Italian century costumes. Jesus and Peter break into that the right scene on ordinary wearing cloaks. They are even



barefoot by contrast. But it is Jesus in the shadow who brings light onto the canvas, and that play on light and darkness heightens the dramatic intensity of the scene. We see simply the face of Jesus and his right hand pointing. But pointing to whom? Is it the bearded man who seems to say, 'Is it me?' or is He pointing to the younger man at the end of the table engrossed in his money?

Perhaps Caravaggio is saying that Jesus can call any and all of us. His call to follow can break into our daily routine at any time of day, whoever we are, whatever we have to commend ourselves, and whatever our faults and worries. As He says in that same chapter, 'I have come to call not the righteous, but sinners.' We can take heart that His church is not a museum of saints: it is a kingdom of sinners who have the courage, like Matthew, to follow.

Communal heroism

Christopher Nolan, the writer and director of *Dunkirk* describes the true event on which it is based as 'one of the greatest stories in human history'. Brilliantly bucking the trend of recent war films he does not resort to gore and special effects, as he provides an immersive experience that enables the viewer to empathise with the young soldiers in their apparently hopeless situation, trapped between the sea and the advancing German army.



By cleverly moving around the timeline, we experience the

different perspectives on land, sea and air. Particularly powerful is the interplay between two characters on one of the small boats heading to Dunkirk. Cillian Murphy plays a shell-shocked soldier picked up from a torpedoed ship, on the outward journey, and desperate not to be taken back towards the beach. Previously having starring roles in Nolan films (*Inception, The Dark Knight*) here Murphy is credited only as 'Shivering Soldier', a nameless character representing the 338,000 beaten and demoralised men who were rescued. Also in the boat is the 17-year-old George (played by Barry Keoghan) who is the only character whose back-story is revealed, when he says he has never achieved anything but wants to do something valuable



with his life. George's only skills appear to be making tea and carrying life-jackets, thus providing a poignant representation of the many ordinary people who joined together to make the Dunkirk evacuation possible.

Nolan says: 'as a group of people we can achieve so much more than we can individually', an important message for all of us. At that crucial time in history, King George VI called the nation to pray. As we pray for our nation today, perhaps God will open our eyes to see how we can each use our limited skills and resources for the common good.


Leprosy mission boxes

`England's Rose'

This month marks 20 years since the funeral of Princess September Diana on 6th 1997. Recently Prince William described how his mother's death was like an earthquake, the shockwaves taking time to sink in. When we remember the days leading up to the funeral, the whole nation seemed touched by her death. Over 32 million people watched



the funeral on television. As we look back to this event, what is its continuing significance?

As those made in the image of God, we are called to reach out to show love to others. 'Dear friends, let us love one another, for love comes from God.' (1 John 4:7). Princess Diana did this, especially the vulnerable in our society, remembering especially her work with AIDS sufferers and landmine victims. However, she was also a flawed individual, who fought various 'demons' in her own life and struggled with relationships. People identified with her humanity as one like us: fallible, weak yet more than good enough.

There is always something powerful about vulnerability in others; we can identify with them because, like us, they don't have it all together. God uses flawed people in his purposes, as we clearly see in the pages of the Bible: Abraham, Moses, David and Paul, to mention just a few!

Ironically, Mother Theresa died the day before Diana's funeral. Again, she was somebody who was much loved for her work among the poor. However, despite being declared a saint last year, she openly talked about the vulnerability of her faith. Mother Teresa revealed that she spent nearly 50 years without a tangible feeling of God's presence in her life! It's not easy to be a perfect saint!
