FOR OUR PRAYERS THIS WEEK

Prayer prompts based on the readings for today:-

Reading this passage from Matthew (9.35-10.8) today brings a sense of dissonance. How are we to relate to the experience of those “sent” by Jesus, within our own new normal of being grounded within the home? Many of us have been sent not out into our communities but sent home to stay safe.

And yet even through our isolation and distance, discipleship and Christian service have remained very much alive. Perhaps today we can be a little imaginative in our ideas of what it means to be sent.

If you are isolating at home for the foreseeable future, how might you find new ways to be “sent”, so that you might proclaim the good news even from your kitchen or living room? If you are emerging from a time of isolation, perhaps to return to work or ministry, how has the experience of recent months changed your ideas of what it means to be “sent”?

Matthew is clear on two things: being sent is never easy. Expect things to get tough. But God goes before us and beside us, and so expect also that wherever and however we are sent at this time, we find God waiting there to meet us.

GOSPEL READING: Matthew 9:35-10:8

All: Glory to you, O Lord

³⁵ Then Jesus went about all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues, and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom, and curing every disease and every sickness. ³⁶ When he saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. ³⁷ Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; ³⁸ therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest."

10 Then Jesus summoned his twelve disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits, to cast them out, and to cure every disease and every sickness. ² These are the names of the twelve apostles: first, Simon, also known as Peter, and his brother Andrew; James son of Zebedee, and his brother John; ³ Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas and Matthew the tax collector; James son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus; ⁴ Simon the Cananaean, and Judas Iscariot, the one who betrayed him.

⁵ These twelve Jesus sent out with the following instructions: "Go nowhere among the Gentiles, and enter no town of the Samaritans, ⁶ but go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. ⁷ As you go, proclaim the good news, 'The kingdom of heaven has come near.' ⁸ Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse the lepers, cast out demons. You received without payment; give without payment.

An Update from the Treasurer (May 31st 2020):-

Once again - THANK YOU for your continued donations which is helping us to continue to pay essential bills.

In May the newly set-up (in response to Covid-19) D/Ds totalled £706 Regular weekly (Green) envelopes plus donations in cash or by cheque delivered to the Rectory have totalled £2573

So **income** (which would have come in through church services had we been physically meeting) totalled **£3279**

This compares to £3743 in May 2019

We must also thank those who have long-standing direct debits (which are not included in the figures above for either 2019 or 2020) for your continued support.

We are making some savings as a result of not physically meeting which helps to balance this a little bit. We obviously have an ongoing loss of income from Hall Hire and as a result we have temporarily reduced our parish share payments to the diocese.
