- 11 The hills were covered with its shadow ◆ and the cedars of God by its boughs.
- 12 It stretched out its branches to the Sea and its tendrils to the River.
- 13 Why then have you broken down its wall, ◆ so that all who pass by pluck off its grapes?
- 14 The wild boar out of the wood tears it off, ◆ and all the insects of the field devour it.
- 15 Turn again, O God of hosts, ◆ look down from heaven and behold;
- 16 Cherish this vine which your right hand has planted, ◆ and the branch that you made so strong for yourself.
- 17 Let those who burnt it with fire, who cut it down, ◆ perish at the rebuke of your countenance.
- 18 Let your hand be upon the man at your right hand, ◆ the son of man you made so strong for yourself.
- 19 And so will we not go back from you; ◆ give us life, and we shall call upon your name.
- 20 Turn us again, O Lord God of hosts; ◆ show the light of your countenance, and we shall be saved.

# GOSPEL READING: Matthew 1:18-25 All: Glory to you O Lord

<sup>18</sup> Now the birth of Jesus the Messiah took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been engaged to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found to be with child from the Holy Spirit. <sup>19</sup> Her husband Joseph, being a righteous man and unwilling to expose her to public disgrace, planned to dismiss her quietly. <sup>20</sup> But just when he had resolved to do this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, 'Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife, for the child conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. <sup>21</sup> She will bear a son, and you are to name him Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins.' <sup>22</sup> All this took place to fulfil what had been spoken by the Lord through the prophet:

<sup>23</sup> 'Look, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel',

which means, 'God is with us.' <sup>24</sup> When Joseph awoke from sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him; he took her as his wife, <sup>25</sup> but had no marital relations with her until she had borne a son; and he named him Jesus.
